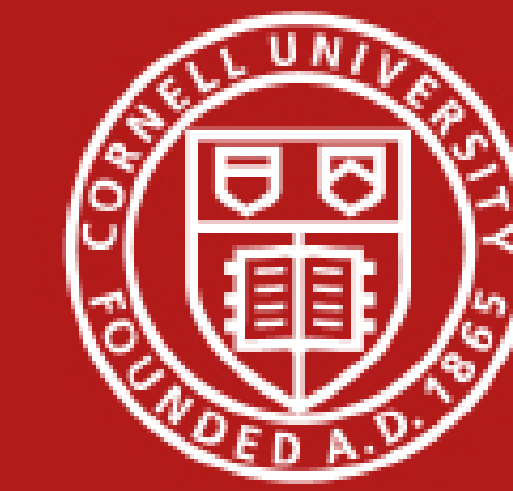


# E-Books in Science and Engineering

## Extra Libraries, Hidden in Plain Sight

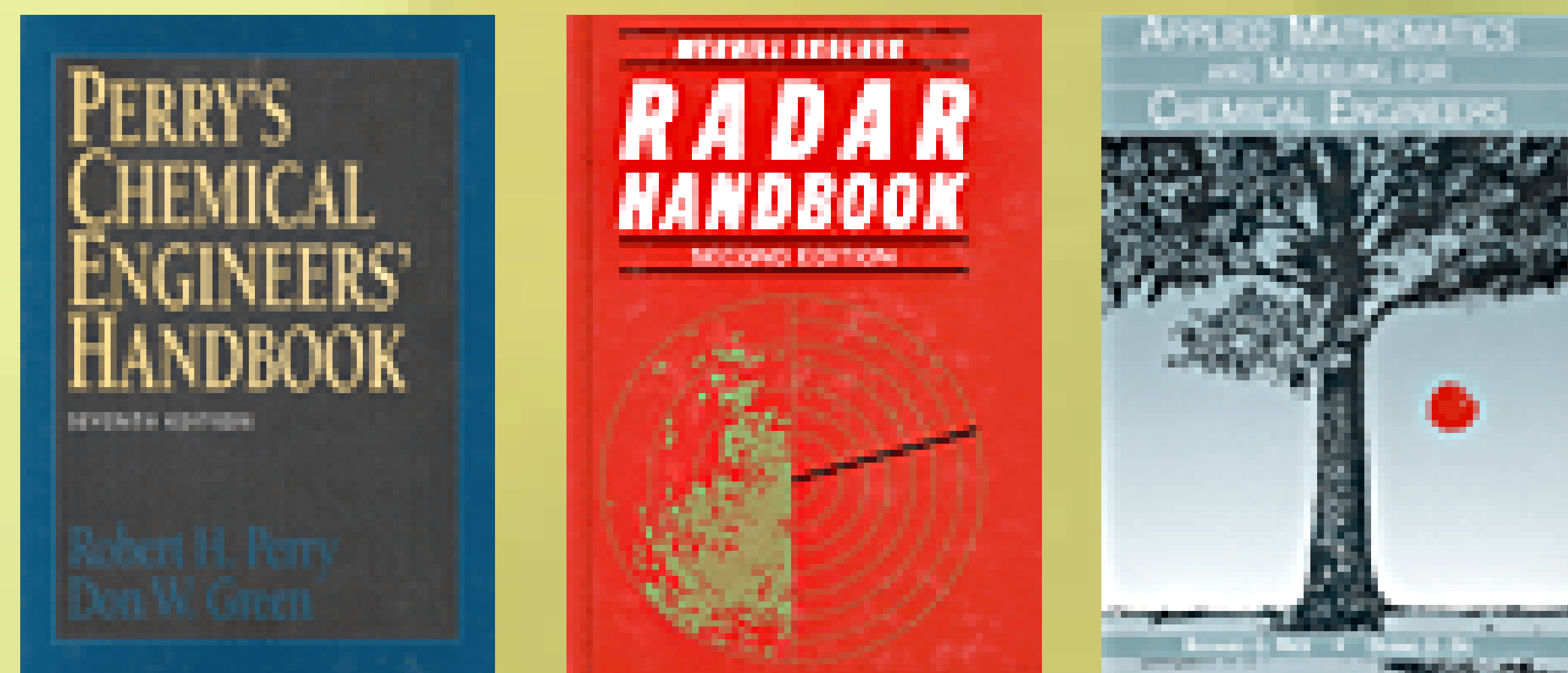
The Cornell University Library system has access to more than 400,000 e-books, including several whole libraries specially designed for use by students, scholars and professionals in science and engineering. These e-books are available in full-text, from anywhere, 24 hours a day and 7 days a week. Some of the individual e-books in these collections are not easy to locate by regular searches in the library catalog. To find them, you need to know where to look.

Knovel is an online technical reference collection of nearly 2,000 e-books in engineering, applied science and technology by publishers such as the AIAA, AiChE, ASME, IEEE and TMS.

Knovel e-books offer chemical properties, formulas, interactive charts, best practices, and safety compliance information.



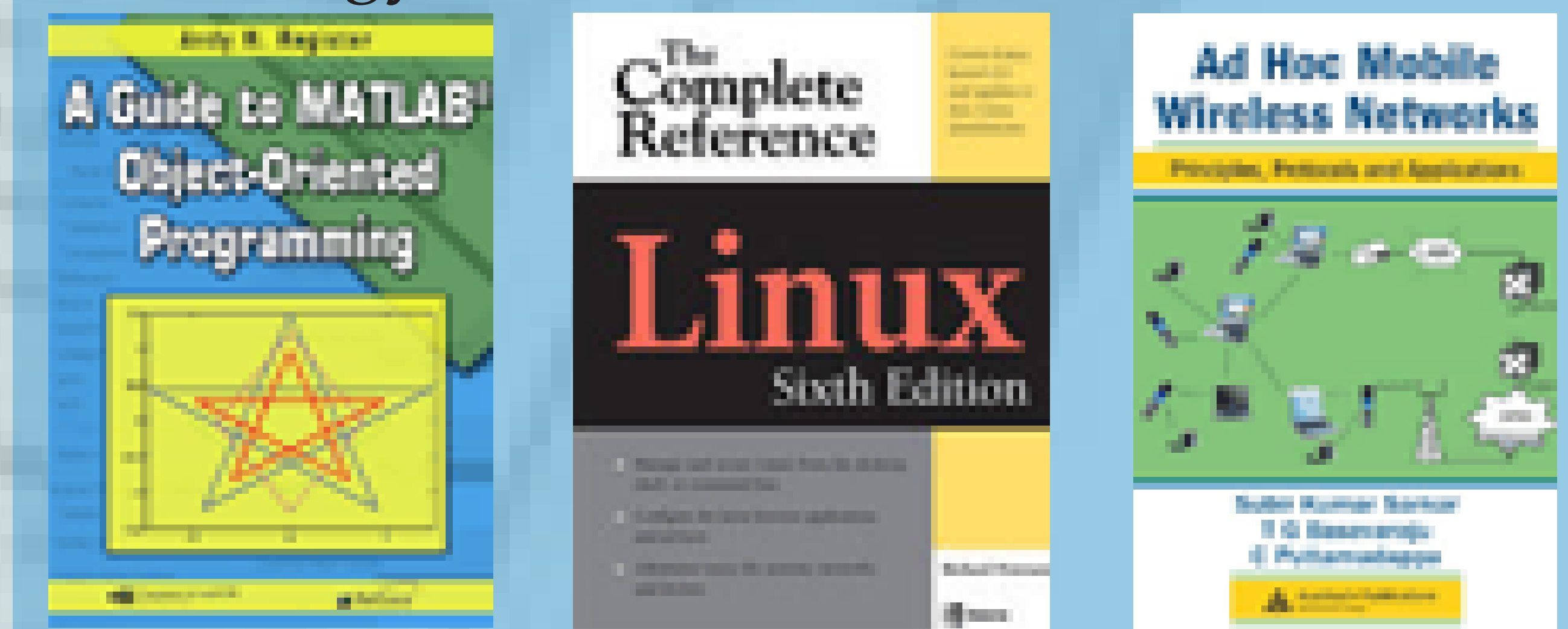

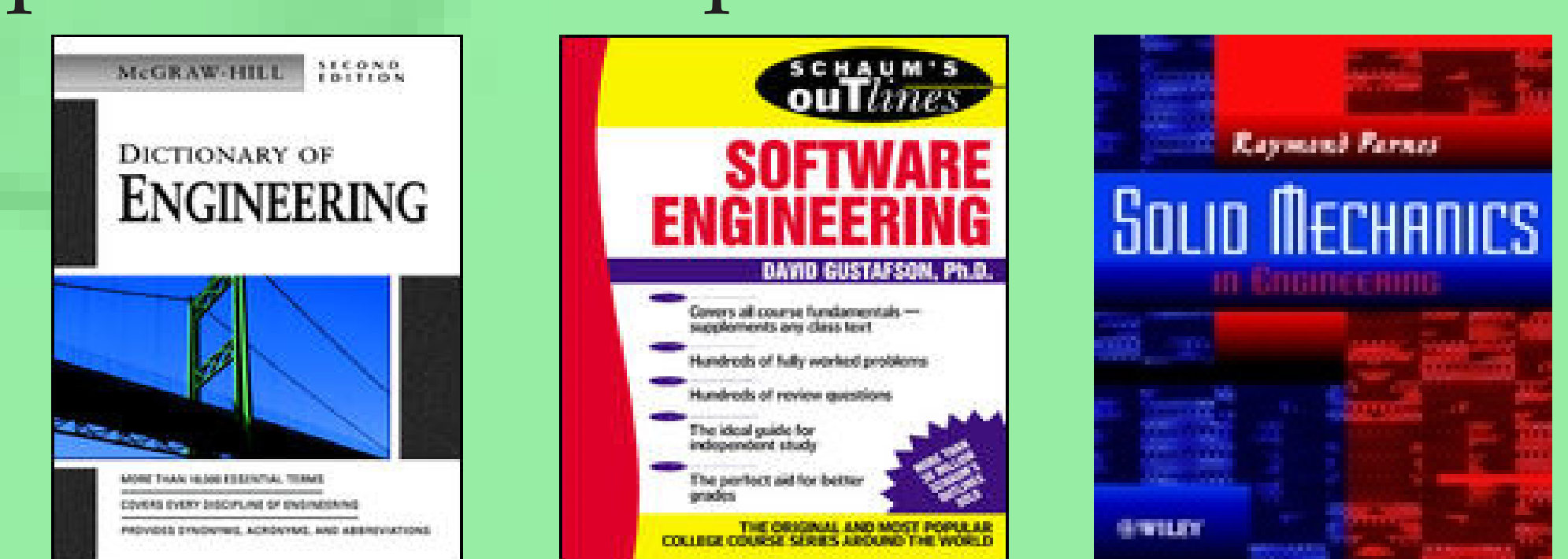
